Dear Friends,

2020 began filled with the excitement of celebrating the 30th anniversary of the Crown Point Community Foundation. A milestone made possible by the vision of Dr. John Birdzell, and our founders who rose to the challenge of establishing a public charitable organization with the mission of enriching the quality of life in Crown Point and the surrounding South Lake County communities.

On March 7th, we gathered for what would be our only in-person event of the year, our annual Volunteer Fair, to facilitate the connection of more than 60 local nonprofit agencies to residents looking to engage in volunteer opportunities.

One week later, life as we knew it changed drastically due to the COVID-19 pandemic and stay at home orders mandated by the Governor. Our Board and staff quickly rose to the challenge putting new strategies into action to work remotely and support the agencies providing critical services to meet the needs of our residents. In response, the CPCF activated its CARE Fund and partnered with Legacy Foundation and Foundations of East Chicago, collaboratively raising almost \$1 million for COVID-19 relief grantmaking efforts throughout Lake County.

We rose to the challenge and continued our commitment of responsive and pro-active grantmaking, pivoted to new approaches to award 100 scholarships to aid students in obtaining their post-secondary education, partnered with multiple stakeholders to explore and implement regional initiatives to foster economic development and opportunities for all, and assisted donors with their philanthropic goals of supporting causes to positively impact residents lives and our communities.

As we look to the next 30 years and beyond, we remain steadfast in our mission.

The CPCF has strategically positioned itself to increase grantmaking that supports a broad range of community needs and to become operationally self-sufficient. The \$2.5 million dollar matching gift challenge launched in November, made possible by the Dean & Barbara White Family Foundation, is an opportunity to accelerate this vision by providing donors a \$1 for \$1 match to grow endowed funds of their choice and increase operating endowment funds.

Thanks to you, our friends and supporters, the Crown Point Community Foundation's future looks bright. We ended the year with a new milestone, assets over \$34 million. Your trust and confidence in the Foundation ensures that it will continue to grow. We are thankful every day for your strong support.

Together, we will continue to rise to the challenge of enriching the quality of life in our communities, now and for generations to come.

# CONNECTING PEOPLE WHO CARE WITH CAUSES THAT MATTER SINCE 1990

In 1989, longtime area physician and community leader Dr. John Birdzell had the idea of establishing a community foundation like the one he had learned about while vacationing in Michigan.

He presented the idea to fellow Crown Point Rotary Club members, including Harold Wheeler, Joe Nerney, Tim Sendak, Mike Grant, Larry Rouge, Herman Barber, and his son John Birdzell. Dr. Birdzell's vision was of a foundation that would invest its endowments and use the income to fund grants to the community in perpetuity. The idea was well received, with Harold Wheeler making the first \$1,000 investment.

The following year, the Crown Point Community Foundation was born. Thirty years later, Dr. Birdzell's vision has resulted in a Foundation with more than 360 funds and \$34 million dollars in managed assets, and an ongoing legacy that has positively impacted countless lives in the South Lake County community.

#### **ABOUT THE CPCF**

Our vision is to serve as a well-managed agent for giving and receiving. The Crown Point Community Foundation will help to positively shape the future of the community and act as a facilitator of community good.

Since 1990, we have served the citizens of Crown Point, Cedar Lake, Lowell, and Winfield through a range of charitable and civic activities while helping individual donors achieve their philanthropic goals. As a public charitable organization, the CPCF is dedicated to building permanently endowed funds. A 19 member volunteer board of directors, composed of local leaders, oversees the investment of these pooled funds. These endowments then fund the distribution of grants to worthy causes each year.

# With your help, seniors were given the technology to access online health services.

The Crown Point Community Foundation awarded a \$1,000 grant to TeleHealth Access for Seniors. The organization's mission is to provide seniors and low-income communities with devices and instructions to connect them to their physicians via telehealth. TeleHealth Access for Seniors gathers used tablets in good condition and uses monetary donations to purchase Android and FIRE tablets to provide access to area seniors. They also provide printed guides, free videos and tech support with student volunteers to help seniors know how to use their devices and access their online services.

"We partner with clinics and hospitals and donate devices to them so that they are able to give the devices to patients in need," said Charlotte Annes, Indiana State Lead for TeleHealth Access for Seniors.

With COVID still a concern, Telehealth has become even more

imperative to seniors. "Telehealth allows patients to contact their physicians, doctors, friends and family quicker and easier," Annes said. "This also allows patients to have regular checkups with their doctors in a socially distanced manner.

The grant from the CPCF helped to purchase tablets to provide to seniors. TeleHealth Access for Seniors is also accepting gently used Amazon Fire HD tablets and other used devices. For more information, please visit www.telehealthforseniors.org.



#### EACH FUND TYPE FULFILLS THE DONOR'S WISHES

Unrestricted Fund distributions are granted to nonprofits providing services within South Lake County. Nonprofits apply for a grant; our grant committee reviews the applications and awards these grants.

Donor Advised and Designated Fund distributions are granted according to the donors instructions, to nonprofit organizations.

Agency Funds are set up by a nonprofit organization to support their operational and program needs.


Operating Fund distributions support the foundation, allowing us to fulfill our mission to our donors, fund holders and community.





# HELPING RESIDENTS OF SOUTH LAKE COUNTY THROUGH THE CPCF'S CARE-EMERGENCY AID & RELIEF FUND.

COVID-19 has had a historic impact on both the health and the financial stability of our community. In response, the Crown Point Community Foundation partnered with the Legacy Foundation and Foundations of East Chicago to offer immediate relief throughout Lake County. During Phase 1 of their efforts, the Foundations awarded \$356,000 in grants to 61 nonprofits between March 30 and May 18, 2020, covering food, childcare, PPE, technology, educational materials, rent/utility assistance, and medical needs.

The CPCF's contributions were made and awarded through its CARE-Emergency Aid and Relief Fund. All grants were made

in collaboration with the area's other Foundations.

"Given the extraordinary impact of COVID-19, it was imperative that we coordinated our relief efforts with the other Foundations," said Mary Nielsen, President of the Crown Point Community Foundation. "We wanted to ensure that we could get the money out quickly without duplicating our efforts."

"The grant has been very useful in supplying our food pantry," said Kevin Toth, Hanover Township Trustee. "We offer food assistance to residents of Hanover Township and Cedar Lake and the grant will go a long way in

helping us provide for those in need in our community."

The community responded as well, donating much-needed funds to the Foundation's efforts. 100% of the donations to the CPCF's emergency relief fund were used to provide direct support to nonprofit organizations delivering critical services to Crown Point, Cedar Lake, Lowell, and Winfield.

"The Food Bank of Northwest Indiana is grateful for the funds from the Lake County COVID-19 Response Fund," said Allyson Vaulx, Director of Development, Food Bank of NWI. "The grant was used to provide targeted Mobile Market food distributions for displaced/unemployed individuals and for senior food box deliveries to seniors who are high risk, without family or disabled. Both programs are newly developed, in direct response to needs brought about by the current crisis. These are populations of people who never needed assistance from the Food Bank before, but are now relying on us to feed their families. The funding from the Lake County COVID-19 Response Fund and Crown Point Community Foundation ensures that we can support and feed our neighbors for as long as necessary."

"Hoosiers Feeding the Hungry is committed to responding to the needs of our communities facing hunger during this critical time," said Amber Zecca, Fund Development Director for Hoosiers Feeding the Hungry. "The funds received from the Crown Point Community Foundation COVID-19 Relief grant were used to pay processing fees on donated livestock. The meat was given to local hunger relief agencies that are serving an ever-increasing amount of food-insecure residents."

The Crown Point Community Foundation, Legacy Foundation, and Foundations of East Chicago partnered for **Phase 2** of the CARE-Emergency and Relief Fund to offer grants of up to \$5,000 to help nonprofit organizations develop and/or implement an Emergency Preparedness or Strategic Restructuring plan. Emergency Preparedness could cover general preparedness (to include all disasters including tornado, fire, pandemic, etc.) or be COVID-19 specific to assist with plan development, supplies and equipment, software or virtual platform expenses. The Foundations awarded \$65,775 in **Phase 2**.



# With your help, a program to provide free bicycles has been on a roll.

The Crown Point Community Foundation awarded a grant for \$2,000 to the local Knights of Columbus for their Bike Project program.

The Knights of Columbus St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Council No. 7473 is a local chapter of the worldwide Catholic nonprofit. The local chapter includes Catholic men from the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Holy Spirit and St. Helen parishes. One of their main programs is their Bike Project. Through the Bike Project, the Council collects used donated bikes, refurbishes them, and distributes them throughout the community. The Bike Project has donated over 1,000 bikes in the last nine years.

"In Lake County there are a lot of families that are living at or below the poverty level that do not have the means to purchase new bikes for their families or transportation to get to a job," said Merlin Foresman, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Council Treasurer. "The Knights perform 100 percent of

the labor to pick up used bikes, refurbish them and then deliver them to individuals and families in need."

The CPCF grant helped pay for tires, tubes, chains, seats and grips to repair the bikes. Since receiving a similar grant from the CPCF in 2019, the Knights have delivered 54 refurbished bicycles.



# With your help, those affected by hair loss from cancer or alopecia (totalis or areata) were given an emotional boost.

A CPCF grant for \$2,500 was given to the Hair for All Foundation.

Hair for All Foundation serves people in active treatment for any type of cancer or alopecia (totalis or areata) by helping them to buy cranial prosthesis (wigs.)

Medical interventions associated with cancer symptoms and treatments are difficult enough. Coping with extreme changes in outward appearance may seem even worse. Hair loss can lead to secondary complications resulting in high blood pressure, stress, anxiety and levels of depression which can hinder progress during recovery. Hair loss and treatment have a psychological, emotional and financial impact on a patient's self-esteem and confidence.

Cancer treatment is not the only condition that can result in hair loss.

Many people also suffer from an autoimmune disease, alopecia (totalis or areata), that can result in hair loss.

Many insurance companies do not reimburse patients for wigs. Because of this, Hair for All Foundation was created to help to reimburse patients for their wig purchases, mailing checks or up to \$150 to help make the purchase of wigs possible. Hair for All Foundation has already served over 200 patients since its inception in 2018.

The CPCF grant helped purchase wigs for patients in South Lake County. For more information, please visit www.hairforall.org.

The grants were awarded by CPCF's grant committee commemorating its 30th anniversary celebration. CPCF President Mary Nielsen reached out to local fire and police departments to identify needs that could be supported with additional funding.

"All departments have been greatly challenged and affected by the Covid-19 pandemic," Nielsen said. "The Foundation wished to show its appreciation to those who put their lives on the line to protect our communities."

The grants were awarded proactively this past December through the CPCF's Unrestricted Community Fund.

One of the challenges in any police department is ensuring the officers are given the proper equipment to carryout their job responsibilities," said Pete Land, Crown Point Chief of Police. "The generosity of the Crown Point Community Foundation in awarding us these funds has helped our Specialty Units immensely. We are grateful for the Foundation's continued support of our police department."

The grants were used to purchase the following equipment:

Crown Point - \$23,500 - Police \$5,500 / Fire: \$18,000

#### **Crown Point Police**

- K-9 Unit Training Aides & Equipment Training gear for K-9 unit.
- Drone Program Drones will help police more efficiently.
- Crash Investigation Unit Camera and Laser Software to help assist with police cases.
- SWAT Unit Ballistic and communications equipment.

#### **Crown Point Fire**

#### - Ventilation Fans

Battery operated units to better suit the department by allowing easier and more efficient storage on the fire trucks and lighter weight for those carrying them.

- Thermal Imaging Cameras Used for searching for possible victims in zero visibility, and find source of the fire, or hidden fires.



### Lowell - \$16,550 - Police \$7,000 / Fire: \$9,550

#### **Lowell Police**

- Bicycle Patrol Program To better serve the community.
- Advanced Physical Tactics Programs Allows officers to train extensively in defensive tactics that both protect them and greatly reduces the risk of injury to offenders.

#### **Lowell Fire**

- Decontamination Units Help clean firefighters gear on scene after a fire.
- Positive Pressure Ventilation Fans Battery powered fans to help vent dangerous and harmful smoke and gases from inside the buildings during fires.







# Lake Dale Volunteer Fire Department - \$14,000

#### - Ventilation Fan

Battery operated units to better suit the department by allowing easier and more efficient storage on the fire trucks and lighter weight for those carrying them.

#### - Jaws of Life Unit

This hydraulic-extrication rescue tool is used in a number of difficult emergency situations, particularly car crashes. It is most often used to pull drivers and passengers out of damaged vehicles after severe traffic collisions.

**Cedar Lake - \$22,000 -** Police \$10,000 / Fire: \$12,000

### **Cedar Lake Police**

- Digital Cameras The cameras will be used for collecting evidence in police cases.

- Jaws of Life Unit Hydraulic-extrication rescue tool





#### - Project Lifesaver Program

GPS wrist tracking devices and program training designed for "at risk" individuals who are prone to the life-threatening behavior of wandering.

#### - Body Cameras

Capture footage from an officer's point of view. Videos can be used as evidence if necessary in a court of law.

- Portable Radios

More efficient communications for the department. Improves real-time decision-making capabilities by providing a quicker response.



# With your help, a Christian summer camp continues to make a splash.

A CPCF grant for \$8,000 was made to Lake Region Christian Assembly for their day camps and year-round mentoring programs.

"Lake Region Christian Assembly/CONNECT Christan Camp has served the Northwest Indiana area for 95 years," said Matthew Chandler, Executive Director or Lake Region Christian Assembly. "We create time and space where people feel safe, relationships flourish, and memories are made."

Historically, the CONNECT Christian Camp has served over 100 students each summer from the south Lake County area. In addition, Lake Region Christian Assembly hosts students and groups from throughout Northwest Indiana and the Chicagoland region with overnight retreats and camps. Going forward, the group is focusing on expanding their day camps and creating new mentoring programs.
