

## With your help, veterans have a new way to be recognized and honored.

A Crown Point Community Foundation grant for \$1,750 was awarded to Wittenberg Village and their honor wall project.

Wittenberg serves many U.S. veterans and widowed spouses of veterans, with veterans and their spouses currently comprising nearly 25% of the community. Wittenberg featured a Veteran's Dedication Wall on their campus, but wanted to expand the installation.

"More than ever, we are understanding the need for people to be recognized for their service to their country," said Wittenberg Village Vice President of Gift Planning Tony Englert. "We feel this is one of the best ways to unite our community, not only for our residents but also for our resident families, visitors and those from the larger community who come to visit our campus."

"As a Korean War veteran, I am so happy to see this wall completed

as a special place to honor those who served our nation," said Wayne Barnes, Wittenberg Village Resident.

The CPCF grant helped to renovate and expand the honor wall, which now features photos of residents who served, flags and medallions for each branch of the service, and special lettering on the wall.

#### Lakeshore Public Media. - match up to \$5,000

Support the replacement of outdated studio equipment that is used to conduct interviews and relay news and information to listeners throughout Northwest Indiana every day of the year.

### Education - \$22,876.00

**Chasing Dreams - \$4,668** Help fund the Dream Summer Camp program.

#### Dunes Learning Center - \$2,500

Outdoor research and career exploration for Crown Point High School Environmental Science students.

#### Tri Town Safety Village - \$15,708

Funding for Crown Point students to attend the Tri Town Safety Village.

## Food, Nutrition, Agriculture - \$32,500.00

Food Bank of Northwest Indiana - \$5,000 Agency Training, purchase of small-appliances for distribution and special programming.


This \$1 for \$1 matching challenge provided donors the opportunity to grow endowed funds of their choice and to increase operating endowment funds to cover the operating costs of the Crown Point Community Foundation. For every dollar that was donated to an endowment fund held at the CPCF, the match contributed another dollar. As these endowments grow, their annual distributions increase, providing more grant dollars out into the community advancing a multitude of opportunities.

## **2022 SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS**

Graduating high school students and Adult Learners who plan on pursuing higher education were given some additional financial assistance this year from the Crown Point Community Foundation. The Foundation awarded 119 scholarships totaling over \$428,000 including eight awarded by Crown Point Tri Kappa. These funds were made available through the generosity of the Foundation's donors and its scholarship funds. 

Corey's family has been long time supporters of the Foundation and believers in what they do. He is honored to have been asked to join the board and looks forward to continuing to make a difference in our community.


## JEFF BAN




